



Oswald Blakeston has achieved infamy in his native England via his poetry, cook books, paintings and experimental films. With Francis Bruguere he pioneered abstract movies in Europe in the 1940s. His mystery novel *Pass the Poison Separately* appeared in 1978 from Canada's Catalyst Press. From 1979-1983 he was Director of Programming for the Beyond Baroque Literary/Arts Center in Venice, California. He is the publisher of Little Caesar Press.
